Could I have caused that issue? When the client or veterinary accused me of cause the issue, is that true?
- 4) The Science To Follow In Treating Skin Issues: Learn methods, techniques, and types of products to fix the skin problems when they occur. Learn principles that will lead to success when treating skin issues. Learn How to grow hair back on those shaved-down dogs. Learn why steroids, antibiotics, and the typical therapies for skin don't always work.

Dog skin is not like ours, so we will learn about canine skin and how and how it is unique. Learn how to use products and tools to protect the skin and keep it healthy. Bathing prep isn't what it used to be. Get your tub and products ready then get started! Learn handling tips to greet dogs and evaluate their temperament before you begin to keep you both safe and happy!

Understand shampoo, conditioners, and special therapies. Learn about dilutions, applicators, frothing and furunculosis. Learn about special applications for short hair, long-hair, tangles and mats, greasy pets, dirty pets, skunked pets, dry skin, itchy skin and more!

Let the dryer make your work easier and know which dryer is the right one for the job! The better you dry, the less you brush and the better the final groom will be! Brushing is an art. We discuss line brushing, fluff drying, detangling and simple de-matting. There are many brushes and combs available. Know which brush is right for each job. Also included is nail trimming and grinding, eyes, ear cleaning, and anal glands.

Handling is discussed throughout this class. Gentle handling helps you and pets. We talk about handling difficult pets and recognizing dangerous pets. Keeping you safe means you enjoy what you do. Keeping pets safe means they enjoy the groomer!
